#### **150 YEARS AS A COUNTRY**

Railroads have been in Canada's history since before Confederation, starting in July 25, 1836 with the Champlain & St. Lawrence Railway. As part of the 150<sup>th</sup>, there are some displays and information on highlights of rail history in Canada. I will share some of these stories in our newsletters over the summer and fall. This issue contains the story of the first railroad in Canada.

# CANADA'S FIRST RAILWAY THE CHAMPLAIN & St. LAWRENCE RAILWAY

Surveying and construction started in 1835 with grading, fencing, and bridge work. Wharves and stations at La Prairie and St. Jean sur Richelieu were constructed.

The first locomotive in Canada arrived from England in 1836 and was named "The Dorchester" with the addition of 4 passenger cars and freight cars.

The first rails were 6" pine logs, squared off, and joined by splice plates and bolts. The pine logs were replaced by iron rails in the 1850's.

The ride took two hours as there were too many passengers and The Dorchester could not pull the load. Two coaches with the dignitaries went on and the rest were pulled by horses.

Two hours later all arrived and the ceremonies were completed.

July 25, 1836 regular operations started. The line was later acquired by the Grand Trunk Railway and later became part of the Canadian National Railway and is still in operation.

There is a replica of The Dorchester in the Canadian Rail Museum, in St-Constant / Delson, Ouebec.


