On Saturday, July 14th, operations were curtailed because of three minor grass fires which were very ably dealt with by our own in house fire department. No damage occurred but the decision was made to suspend running by coal fired locomotives. (Editor's note: I was in attendance and volunteered in the fire suppression. It is intended to operate the locomotives on the Civic Holiday Monday, August 6 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Then, on Friday, August 10th, we will be hosting a visit by the Buick Car »Club of Canada and the track will be in operation from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. for that day. Saturday, August 18th will be a regular running day from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
