ABERFOYLE JUNCTION MODEL RAILWAY

The famous Aberfoyle Junction Model Railway, which was forced to move from its' home of 30 years in Aberfoyle, due to a change in ownership of the property, has successfully relocated to St. Jacobs, ON. The model railway will reopen to the public on the weekend FOLLOWING Thanksgiving weekend. The new layout, which is actually the old layout reassembled in a larger, more spacious building, is now known as the St. Jacobs and Aberfoyle Model Railway. Projected open days are as follows:

MODEL RAILROAD

Our number 4 melted several fire bars but still ended the day in fine style. It seems to be a minor problem with excess lubrication which has been fixed and the new blast pipe promises well.

If the weather holds, we should get another opportunity to make use of the track with the next steam up scheduled for Thursday, October 17, 2013 when the museum will be hosting a party from Dorchester.

The winter maintenance program has #4 in fir new tyres, the blanks have been cut and the i/d machined. Then the o/d will be machined after shrinking onto the wheel centres.

The Sarnia loco, the K.D. Fortner, is due for piston rings.

#3 needs a paint job but is otherwise in good shape.
