MUSEUM OPPORTUNITIES

At the October 2015 meeting of the Komoka Railway Museum, the president shared some thoughts to address realities of the future. These are shared with the members who were not there to encourage thoughts and ideas for the future and all suggestions are welcome to the executive.

1) IMMEDIATE CONCERNS

The deck around the station is deteriorating and is becoming a safety concern. A solution needs to be put into place for spring 2016.

2) WITHIN ONE YEAR

- -Complete the concrete floor in the large exhibit building and begin setting up displays of items in storage to be added to the museum tours
 - -Repainting of the front of the station & caboose
 - -Completing of the roof repairs and HVAC systems for the baggage car
 - -Upon completion of the baggage car items above, finish interior
- -Begin setting up library in baggage car and setting up other displays to become part of museum tours
- -Remove stored items in caboose and set up caboose to become part of museum tours 2) WITHIN EIGHTEEN MONTHS
- -Convert the former "Waiting Room" of the station into a Komoka and local history room
 - -Repaint the baggage car

3) WITHIN FIVE YEARS

- -Investigate funding for a part time curator/museum guide
- -Communicate with other museums like the Lucan Museum, Fanshawe Pioneer Village to see what resources they have available e.g. staff with experience in certain areas e.g. displays, marketing, preservation, fund raising that could assist the museum
- -Enlist the support either through financial, labour or material donations via community partners
- -Partner with other museums and historical agencies for the effective locations of items that are surplus to the museum's collection or receive items that would be better located at Komoka Railway Museum

In closing, this review and suggestions are needed for the long term commitment to the Komoka Railway Museum's continued growth of railway history through the growing of the number of younger volunteers; growing of financial strength; and building stronger community ties and partners.
