- --Repairs to the deck. Seeking grant for wood to replace portions of deck in spring. Use volunteer and/or student labour next spring/summer to redo the deck.

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A recent surprise visit to the shops by the Grand Poobah himself found three boilers in hand, a haystack for a Baldwin being blanked off for a hydraulic test, a vertical for a Sentinel and a Belpaire for #4 awaiting flanging blocks.

The traction motor from #3 has been removed and will be shipped out for a quote, the motor itself is obsolete and a replacement would require some alterations to the chassis.

The stores department found another small quantity of soft coal (Pocahontas?) this has been through the screens and is ready for next season. Rumour has it that there may be yet still more hiding in some dark corner. There is known to be a sample of soft coal that was tried last year and deemed unsuitable for locomotive use but maybe worth a second trial mixed with Anthracite.

The track gang has finally made a start on easing the long drag out of Murray's Landing, the vegetation control crew, to a man, volunteered to help but soon found some vegetation requiring immediate attention, however, a start has been made and it may not be as big a job as previously thought.

The newly arrived 1880's era bench in its new location. These benches were from the CN Palmerston station.

After research, it was determined that the wood is light oak with a walnut stain rubbed over the wood, a common finishing practice in the late 1800's. In order to maintain as much of their originality as possible, the benches will be cleaned only and repaired where necessary, to remove the years of dust and accumulations. The benches will not be refinished.



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While picking up the benches, it was discovered that two of the out buildings that were part of the Komoka station, had been relocated and restored near Thamesford. The building in the picture on the left is where oil, gasoline etc was stored. The building in the picture on the right is the section building. Good to see these buildings have survived.





SOME RAILWAY HISTORICAL ITEMS FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER:

November 10, 1853 Great Western Railway opened from Hamilton to Suspension Bridge, Niagara Falls

November 1-2, 1856 Celebration in Montreal of the opening of Grand Trunk Railway November 1872 Grand Trunk between Sarnia and Buffalo via London and Stratford changed to standard gauge

November 1883 Standardized time keeping using hour wide time zones adopted by railroads November 1, 1885 First CP train service between Montreal and Winnipeg

November 7, 1885 Last spike driven at Craigellahie BC for the first Canadian transcontinental line

November 8, 1885 CP train arrives at Port Moody, being the first train to travel Canada from sea to sea

November 2,1887 First passenger cars in Canada outfitted with electric lights

November 1-4, 1925 CN diesel electric car sets record run from Montreal to Vancouver in 67 hours 7 minutes

November 1952 CN Bonaventure station in Montreal is demolished

November 5, 1959 CN opens international marshalling yard in Sarnia

November 6, 1960 The last official steam locomotive to operate on CP runs from St. Lin to Montreal, a 4-4-0- class #29

November 14, 1989 CP begins operation of cabooseless trains
