

The museum will be represented at a series of upcoming meeting of various historical groups to discuss a possible formation of a Middlesex County Archives.

RAIL SAFETY is important because accidents can be deadly. See link below for some facts and answers to some questions about railroads you might not know. Some do not have internet access, so here are the answers to the questions from last months newsletter?

Did you ever want to know how many rail crossings there are in Canada? *There are approximately 40,000 railway crossings in Canada.*

How quickly can a train stop?

Trains can't stop quickly. The average freight train travelling at 100 km/h — or passenger train travelling at 160 km/h — requires about 2 km to stop. That's the equivalent of the length of 18 football fields.

What to do if your vehicle gets stalled on the tracks?

Get out of your vehicle and move at least 30 m from the tracks. Call 911 or look for the railway company's emergency number posted on the back of the crossbuck, or on the signal house.

What is the fine for trespassing on railway property?

Fines for trespassing on railway property vary between provinces. But if you're caught, you could be fined up to \$50,000.

How much does a freight train weigh?

The average locomotive alone weighs 110 tonnes, but a train can weigh tens of thousands of tonnes. A person or a car is no match for it: a train hitting a car is like a car hitting a pop can.
