The Komoka Railway Museum will be participating with Middlesex Centre with plantings, to encourage the Monarch butterflies and pollinators, which are at risk.



summer of 1888 was not a normal one for southern railroads. With the appearance of yellow fever in Jacksonville in July, the region's railroads were potential vectors for the disease's spread. Instead of holding typical passengers, the disputed trains at Callahan carried refugees fleeing a raging epidemic of yellow fever in Jacksonville. Growing out of the possibility of infection from a horrible disease, the conflict was a matter of community survival for the localities involved. Callahan's railroad connections, acquired with the Waycross Short Line's completion in 1881, had gone from being a boon to threatening the town's very existence."
