KOMOKA RAILWAY MUSEUM FUND RAISING 2020

The museum is at a time in its life cycle where there needs to be restorations and repairs to many items due to weathering and aging. Below is a partial list

- The museum deck needs replacing.
- Our baggage car and caboose both need repainting and some improvements.
- The Shay building needs the two patio doors replaced as they have deteriorated. Interior lighting needs to be improved.
- The door and entranceway to our large building needs replacing.

Our volunteers are aging and many of these projects cannot be done by volunteer labour any longer. The cost of paying a contractor to do these repairs and restorations must be now incorporated into the cost of the projects, which means extra funds are needed.

The Komoka Railway Museum is launching a \$20,000 fund raising to keep the museum in good repair and restoration. The fund raising will be launched through Canada Helps and donours can give a one-time gift or give monthly. The option is there for however you would like to contribute.
